Intensive English Program (IEP)

A flexible pathway to direct entry

Typical Progression for Intensive English Program (IEP)

* Progression to CEAP and Full Academic Program is based on student performance. If students do not progress after Semester 1 of CEAP, they are given one additional semester to complete the program. Students who do not progress to full admission after two semesters in CEAP will not be allowed to continue in the program.

IEP students can progress to CEAP OR to Full Admission in as little as one semester:

IEP Levels 1-3 progress to higher levels of IEP through class grades (“C” or higher in all classes) or end-of-semester English Language Test (ELT) placement scores

To progress from IEP to CEAP:

- Level 4 or 5: 3.0 GPA (or higher) in IEP semester 1, or
- Level 1-5:
 - TOEFL 61 overall with 17 writing subscore
 - IELTS 5.0 with 4.5 writing subscore
 - Nebraska ELT score of 69 – 73

To progress from IEP to Full Admission (skipping CEAP):

- Qualifying English test score:
 - TOEFL 70 overall with 20 writing subscore
 - IELTS 6.0 with 5.5 writing subscore
 - UNL ELT score of 74 or higher

Credit English For Academic Purposes (CEAP) Program

Earn credit and start your desired major with one semester of advanced English*

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| Program features: <ul style="list-style-type: none">CEAP is a one-semester program (15 weeks)Students take three English courses, one regular degree course, and one seminar course.Students take 13-15 credit hours (depending on the regular degree course) and all credits count toward their intended bachelor’s degree. | Entry Requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none">2.0 cumulative GPA (and 2.0 GPA during last semester for transfers)Completion of broad coursework in science, math, social science and languageHigh school graduationTOEFL of 61 (17 writing) or IELTS of 5.0 (4.5 writing) |

To progress from CEAP to Full Admission:

- Achieve a CEAP semester GPA of 3.0 or higher

OR

- Achieve a qualifying English test score:
 - TOEFL 70 overall with 20 writing subscore
 - IELTS 6.0 with 5.5 writing subscore
 - Nebraska ELT score of 74 or higher

* Progression to CEAP and Full Academic Program is based on student performance. If students do not progress after Semester 1 of CEAP, they are given one additional semester to complete the program. Students who do not progress to full admission after two semesters in CEAP will not be allowed to continue in the program.

Fees, Dates & Scholarships

Scholarships

All international students including CEAP and IEP applicants are evaluated for merit-based scholarship after they are admitted to Nebraska.

- Global Laureate **\$15,000**
- Global Excellency **\$12,000**
- Global Ambassador **\$10,000**
- Global Diplomat **\$8,000**
- Global Delegate **\$4,000**
- Global Consul **\$2,000**

Scholarships are renewable annually.

Fees

The semester total represents the estimated amount that must be shown on the bank statement or scholarship letter in order to be issued an I-20 for students enrolled in the Intensive English Program who do not intend to earn a degree from Nebraska.

Conditionally admitted students must show an estimated \$44,259 to receive an I-20.
