
- Five proficiency levels (each level is one semester)
- 15-week semesters (fall & spring)
- ^o 20 hours of classes per week (300 hours)
- 10-week semester (summer)
 - ^o 25 hours of classes per week (250 hours)

Entry Requirements:

- 2.0 cumulative GPA (and 2.0 GPA during last semester for transfers)
- Completion of broad coursework in science, math, social science and language
- High school graduation
- No TOEFL or IELTS score required

Typical Progression for Intensive English Program (IEP)



* Progression to CEAP and Full Academic Program is based on student performance. If students do not progress after Semester 1 of CEAP, they are given one additional semester to complete the program. Students who do not progress to full admission after two semesters in CEAP will not be allowed to continue in the program.

IEP students can progress to CEAP OR to Full Admission in as little as one semester:

IEP Levels 1-3 progress to higher levels of IEP through class grades ("C" or higher in all classes) or end-of-semester English Language Test (ELT) placement scores

To progress from IEP to CEAP:

- Level 4 or 5: 3.0 GPA (or higher) in IEP semester 1, or
- Level 1-5:
- ^o TOEFL 61 overall with 17 writing subscore
- ^o IELTS 5.0 with 4.5 writing subscore
- ^o Nebraska ELT score of 69 73

To progress from IEP to Full Admission (skipping CEAP):

- Qualifying English test score:
- ° TOEFL 70 overall with 20 writing subscore
- ^o IELTS 6.0 with 5.5 writing subscore
- ^o UNL ELT score of 74 or higher

Credit English For Academic Purposes (CEAP) Program

Earn credit and start your desired major with one semester of advanced English*

Program features:

Entry Requirements:

- CEAP is a one-semester program (15 weeks)
- Students take three English courses, one regular degree course, and one seminar course.
- Students take 13-15 credit hours (depending on the regular degree course) and **all credits count toward their** intended bachelor's degree.


